The Spanish Literature Program is held only in:

Madrid:

Located in the heart of the Iberian Peninsula, Madrid is Spain's capital. Here the modern co-exists with the historical in a city that offers a wide range of cultural and artistic highlights. Near Madrid lies the Royal Monastery of San Lorenzo de El Escorial, an impressive palace and monastery complex built by Philip II and considered one of the eight wonders of the world. The Aranjuez Royal Residence, a former royal retreat, is nearby. UNESCO has declared both historical sites as World Heritage Landscapes. The beautiful city of Alcalá de Henares, a World Heritage Site, is a short step away.

The objectives of the Spanish Literature Program are to help students understand, interpret and analyze Spanish and Latin American literature and prepare them for the AP Spanish Literature Exam.

The reading list for the AP Spanish Literature Program introduces students to the rich array of voices and cultures found in Spanish-language literature. Students will read authentic editions of select works in Spanish. In addition, the cultural immersion experience will also enable students to improve their Spanish communication skills while practicing for their AP exam.

Terms and Conditions of the Spanish Language Program and Spanish Literature Program

Housing

Housing includes a shared room and three meals daily with a Spanish family. Students who prefer a single room or student dormitory must indicate their housing preference on the registration form. Prices include accommodation the Sunday prior to the start of classes until the Saturday after the end of classes. Should a student wish to arrive or depart on dates other than those established, he or she must make arrangements with the school's program coordinator.

Students must notify the host family or dormitory of any special medical conditions or needs. Students will receive information on housing terms and conditions in the Student Handbook.

Transportation to and from the airport

Transportation to and from the international airport closest to the host family or dormitory will be provided on the dates and hours established for student arrival and departure. A representative designated by the school will meet students at the airport upon arrival and see them off on a designated date at the end of the program. If students plan to arrive or depart at any time other than the established dates, they must make their own arrangements with the school.

Accident and health insurance

Insurance coverage begins upon student arrival in Spain and is valid for the duration of the program. Coverage includes:

- Medical attention in case of accident or illness
- Hospital costs up to € 1,500, including surgery, medical fees, and drug prescriptions
- Patient evacuation or repatriation in case of death

For greater coverage, students are advised to obtain additional insurance.

Rules of conduct

Students agree to follow the rules established by the school and host families. Serious misconduct may be grounds for expulsion. The cost of returning to the United States before the designated time will be paid by the student. Students who are expelled shall not be reimbursed for any fees, nor shall they receive a certificate of completion.

Authorization for students under the age of 18

Registration forms for students under the age of 18 must be signed by the student's legal guardian(s).

The Spanish Language and Literature Programs do not accept individual registrations for students under the age of 16. However, students who turn 16 anytime during 2011 may enroll individually.
